ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS

SECTION I

by the club president. The membership shall be advised two weeks in advance of the meeting by the secretary as to the time and place selected. Meetings may be closed to visitors as the occasion requires. club shall meet at least bi-monthly at a time and place designated lub president. The membership shall be advised two weeks in

SECTION 2

Moetings shall consist of the necessary business, conforming to Robert's Rules of Order, followed by an appropriate program of interest the members.

ARTICLE VII

AMENDMENT OF BYLANS

Amendments shall require a written petition to the secretary and have the signatures of at least five full members. The secretary shall mail a copy of the proposed amendment to each eligible member not less than seven (7) days prior to the next meeting. Amendments can also be passed from the floor through due process.

- For purposes of voting on an amendment, a quorum shall consist of two thirds of the full membership.
- A two thirds majority vote of the quorum shall be required for acceptance.
- 0 In the absence of a quorum, the secretary shall distribute ballots to the eligible members at least seven (7) days before the next regular meeting. A two thirds majority of the vote received within thirty days from distribution shall constitute acceptance or rejection of the amendment.

ARTICLE VIII

FEES AND ASSESSMENTS

Renewal of dues shall be required prior to each anniversary date following initiation in order to retain full membership. Initial for associate membership if four (4) dollars. SECTION 1 Initiation fee of six (6) dollars if required for full membership. Initiation fee
