From the Prez:

How is everyone doing this winter? It sure has been cold here. Solar flux numbers are way up, in the 270 range, making conditions really great at times. Low band conditions, however, are hurting as witnessed by the 80m propagation during the past Sprint. Speaking of Sprint - CW, that is, Kevin our V.P. organized three teams. Team one seems to have done well, team two did a good job, however, there were several no shows. As for team three, I believe that only Bruce, WE7G was active. I realize that some of you may only have been notified a day or two before the Sprint, so making arrangements may have been difficult, but guys, you could have at least gotten on for an hour or so to work the other SCCC members.

Most of us realize that even though the Sprint is only a four hour long contest, it can present a major mental obstacle in psyching up of oneself. If you are not prepared for a full effort, treat it like a DX contest and answer the CQs you feel comfortable with. Who knows, after an hour or so your mind may loosen up, the adrenaline may start pumping and you may think to yourself, wow, what a contest! By the way, we all tend to think that the guys that win are operating from the best stations in the U.S. Not so, several of the top ops this year because of the weather were not able to operate from their choice stations. One fellow in Colorado had over 320 QSOs using a KT-34 at 35 ft and dipoles at 40 ft. Another station in '5' land used only a Butternut vertical and was close to the 290 QSO level. So its not just the biggest stations that finish near the top.

In talking to Darrell, N6DX, the DX packet nets are spreading and really something to see and use. So far, Dick - NN6U is the main control station with links to San Diego, San Fernando Valley and Rainbow Ridge. Over the weekend I talked to Bill - WA6IET, an SCCC member in the Santa Maria area, he is trying to link the Northern Calif area to the Southern Calif area which would open up many more users. During the CQ 160m contest from Rainbow Ridge, I played with the DX packet net. Boy, was it fun! Its full of info, statistics, DX listings, etc. So I'm now in the market for a TNS. Rainbow Ridge has a packet repeater on 144.76 for those of you that cannot reach the Orange County area.

Next meeting of the SCCC will be on Feb 25, at about 11:00 AM at Luigi's, near the intersection of the 405 and Rosecans. Again, the meeting is after the TRW Swapmeet. At the meeting, I'd like to bring up some thoughts on SCCC activities and also see if the SCCC has ideas for the DX Convention this year.
